

RESOLUTION NO. R- 2966

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND EXPRESSING SUPPORT AND ENDORSEMENT OF THE KIRKLAND CITY COUNCIL FOR THE "PRO-PARKS" PARK AND RECREATION BOND ISSUE BEING KING COUNTY PROPOSITION NO. One (1) TO BE SUBMITTED ON NOVEMBER 2, 1982 TO THE VOTERS OF KING COUNTY PURSUANT TO KING COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 6105.

Whereas, a citizens' committee popularly referred to as the "Pro-Park" committee, representative of local and county-wide public and private interests, has over the past several years investigated, studied and reviewed the public park recreation and open space needs and requirements for King County on county-wide regional community and local levels; and

Whereas, said Pro-Parks committee has recommended to the King County Council, a program for park acquisition, construction, development and improvement to be funded by county-wide general obligation bonds not to exceed \$188,250,000 and to be carried on pursuant to an allocation program similar to that used so successfully during the "King County Forward Thrust" program; and

Whereas, the King County Council, by Ordinance No. 6105 has placed the proposal on the ballot to be voted on November 2, 1982 by the voters of King County; and

Whereas, the Pro-Parks program includes acquisition, development and improvement of parks, recreation and open space, within and adjacent to the City of Kirkland and is generally consistent with Kirkland's own park and recreation program and plan; and

Whereas, the City Council for the City of Kirkland at regular open public meeting provided opportunity for and listened to arguments both for and against King County proposition No.

One (1) Park and Recreation Bonds, having the following ballot title:

"Shall King County, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, developing and improving public park, recreation and open space facilities within the county, issue its general obligation bonds in principal amount, not to exceed \$188,250,000, maturing commencing not less than two or more than five years and ending not more but may be less than twenty years from their date of issue, both principal and interest to be paid out of annual tax levies upon all of the taxable property within King County in excess of the regular property tax levy, all as more specifically provided in King County Ordinance No. 6105?"


Now, therefore, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Kirkland does hereby endorse and urge all registered voters to vote on and approve passage of the King County Park and Recreation bond issue (Pro-Parks) which will appear as King County Proposition No. One (1) at the general election on November 2, 1982.


Copies of this resolution should be made available to all persons who express an interest.
