ORDINANCE NO. 33 ✓

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PUTTING OF LOGS, SHINGLEBOLTS, ETC. INTO THE WATERS OF LAKE WASHINGTON FROM OR OVER ANY PUBLIC BRIDGE, DOCK, SIDEWALK, BULKHEAD OR RAILING.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND:

SECTION I.

Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to deposit in the waters of Lake Washington within the corporate limits of the Town of Kirkland and from or over any public bridge, dock, sidewalk, bulkhead or railing within said town, any logs, shinglebolts, lumber or cord wood without first depositing with the Town Clerk the sum of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, and receiving from said Clerk a permit signed by said Clerk, designating the place at which said logs or other material may be deposited in the lake.

SECTION II.

Any person, firm or corporation receiving a permit, as referred to in Section I hereof, before unloading said logs, shinglebolts, etc. into said lake, shall cause to be erected at the point designated in said permit, suitable skidways supported by sufficient bearings to prevent any weight upon said bulkhead or upon a bridge, dock or sidewalk railing, and in all cases, said person, firm or corporation shall make such arrangements that the unloading of said logs, etc. above referred to shall not interfere with the free use of said sidewalk, bridge or dock, shall not injure the same, or the railing in connection therewith, that he will not permit bark, rubbish or similar material to collect about said point, and in all cases the public improvements at the point where said unloading is done, shall be left in as good condition when said unloading is completed as at the time of commencement thereof.

SECTION III.

The deposit of Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars above referred to shall be to guarantee the faithful compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance by any person holding a permit as above referred to, and for any failure to comply with any of the terms hereof, said money shall be forfeited, to be retained by the town as liquidated damages for such failure.

SECTION IV.

Any person desiring to withdraw his deposit shall notify the chairman of the Streets Committee in said town of his intention. It shall thereupon become the duty of said chairman to ascertain if such person has faithfully complied with the provisions of this Ordinance, and if so, he shall endorse on the permit held by said individual, an order directing the clerk to return to said person his deposit, and upon the presentation of said permit so endorsed, it shall be the duty of said clerk to re-pay said deposit.

SECTION V.

Any person depositing logs, shinglebolts, etc. in the waters of Lake Washington without first complying with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, may be fined in any sum not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, or imprisoned not exceeding ten (10) days.
