

ORDINANCE NO. 40.

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING CERTAIN STRUCTURES ON BOLD STREET
IN THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND TO BE A NUISANCE, AND
PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL OF SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND:

THAT, WHEREAS, the east side of Bold Street,
adjacent to Block 192 in the Plat of the Town of Kirkland,
is to be improved by the construction of a wooden sidewalk;

AND, WHEREAS, there are certain porches extending
from the buildings on lots five (5), six (6), seven (7) and
eight (8), in said Block, over and above the line of said
sidewalk of said public highway, known as Bold Street;

AND, WHEREAS, said porches are in a decayed and
ruinous condition and constitute a menace to those passing
under them along said sidewalk;

NOW, THEREFORE, those certain porches adjacent to
and extending westward from lots five (5), six (6), seven (7)
and eight (8), in Block One Ninety-two (192) in the Plat of
the Town of Kirkland, and projecting on to Bold Street, in
said Town, are hereby declared to be a nuisance, and the Town
Attorney is hereby directed to notify the owners of said
premises forthwith that said structures must be removed by them
within ten days from the approval of this Ordinance, and that
in default thereof said structures will be removed by the Town.
