ORDINANCE No 93.

An ordinance prohibiting the running at large within the corporate limits of the town of Kirkland of any horse, mule, cow or other animal from the hour of seven O'Clock P.M. until the hour of six O'Clock A.M. with a bell or anyother noise making device fastened to the neck or anyother part of said animal, and providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance.

Be it ordained by the council of the town of Kirkland;

Section 1.

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons owning, having in charge or under control any horse, mule, cow, or other animal, to permit, suffer or allow said animal to run at large within the corporate limits of the town of Kirkland from the hour of ~~six~~ ^{seven} O'Clock P.M. until the hour six O'Clock A.M. with a bell or anyother noise making device fastened to the neck or anyother part of said animal.

Section 2.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine in any sum of not less than one dollar nor more than twenty five dollars.
