ORDINANCE No. 109.

AN ORDINANCE specifying and dopting the system or plan proposed to construct, condemn and purchase, purchase, acquire, maintain and operate a system of waterworks for the Town of Kirkland, within or without its limits, declaring the estimated cost thereof, as near as may be, and submitting said system or plan, and the proposition and authority to be come indebted therefor, to the qualified voters of the Town of Kirkland for ratification or rejection at a special election to be held on the fifteenth (15th) day of March, 1913. Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Kirkland:

Sec. 1. That the Town of Kirkland hereby specifies and adopts the system or plan to construct, condemn and purchase, purchase, acquire- maintain and operate a system of waterworks, within or without its limits, for the purpose of furnishing such town, and the inhabitants thereof, and any other persons, with an ample supply of water for all uses and purposes, public and private, including water power and other power derived therefrom, as specified in Section Two (2) of this ordinance, declares may be, and proposes to become indebted therefor as cot forth in Section Five (5) of this ordinance, and does hereby submit to the qualified cation or rejection, at the special election to be held in caid Town on Saturday, the 15th day of March A. B., 1913, said system or plan and the proposition and authority to become indebted and to issue bonds therefor.

Sec. 2. That the plan or system of said proposed system of waterworks of said Town is hereby specified and idopted, and the estimated cost hereof, as near as may be, is hereby leclared to be as follows, to-wit:

It is proposed to construct, condemn and purchase, purchase, acquiremaintain and operate a system of waterworks, within or without the limits of the Town of Kirkland, for the purpose of furnishing such town, and the inhabitants thereof, and any other persons, with an ample supply of water for all uses and purposes, public and private, including water- such form and body such date as may power and other power derived there hereafter be prescribed by the Town

That it is proposed to condemn and purchase, purchase or otherwise acquire approximately ten acres of land in the following manner, to-wit: together with a water supply for said system on the creek commonly known as the Cochran Springs, in Section Seventeen (17), Township Twenty-five (25) North, Range Five (5) East, W. M.; to construct at or near the intake on said creek suitable settling basins; to lay a trunk watermain from the point of intake a distance of about fifteen thousand (15,000) feet to a point near the Kirk land Dock in the Town of Kirkland, thence continuing in a northerly direction to a connection with a reservoir or standpipe; to construct a pumping plant or an automatic ram, as the Council by ordinance may determine, at or near the intersection of Piccadilly Avenue and Oxford Street; to construct such storage tank or tanks, at such place or places, and of such dimension or dimensions, as the Council shall by ordinance determine; and the acquisition of such lands, rights-of-way- water rightseasements and privileges, as may be necessary for the construction, protection and maintenance of such water supply system.

Sec. 3 That the estimated cost of the system or plan herein specified and adopted is heheby declared, ac near as may be, to be the sum of Dighteen Thousand Two Hundred Fifty (18,250.) Dollars.

Sec. 4. A special election shall be held in the Town of Kirkland, and the voting precinct therein, on the 15th day of March, A. D., 1913 for the estimated cost thereof, as near as the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said Town of Kirkland, the question of the ratification or rejection of said proposed plan and system for a water works system for said town, as proposed in Section voters of said Town, for their ratifi- 2 herein, and the question of the incurring of bonded indebtedness in the sum of Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred Fifty (\$18,250.) Dollars, and the issuance of bonds therefor, as provided in Section 5 hereof.

Sec. 5. That the Town of Kirkland become indebted and issue general town bonds to raise revenue to meet the cost of said system or plan, in an amount not exceeding the said estimated cost of Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred Fifty (\$18,250.) Dollars; said bonds to be payable twenty (20) years from their date of issue; to bear interest not exceeding Six (6 percent.) per annum, payable semiannually, for which coupons shall be attached to and made a part cf:said bonds, and to be payable, both principal and interest, at the fiscal agency of the State of Washington, in New oses, York City; said bonds shall be in

Sec. 6. The proposition and question so submitted shall be voted upon

Every voter at such election desiring to vote in favor of the said proposed system or plan, and the issuance and sale of said bonds, shall vote a ballot containing the following statement of the said proposition, to

"IN FAVOR of the proposition and question of specifying and adopting the system or plan proposed to construct, condemn and purchase, purchase, acquire, maintain and operate a system of waterworks within or without the limits of the Town of Kirkland for the purpose of furn'shng such town and the inhabitants hereof, and any other paracus, with an ample surply of water for all ases and purposes, public and private, including waterpower and other powor derived therefrom, as specified and alepted in Egetion Two (2) of ordinames No (109) of said Town, approved Pebruary 18th, 1913, and authorizing i bonded indebtedness for the purpove of providing funds for the construction of said waterworks system, and the issuance and sale of general accettable coupon bends of said Fown of Kirkland in the sum of Lighteen Thousand Two Hundred Fifty (\$18,250.) Dollars, payable (20) twenty years from date thereof, and coaring interest at the rate of Six (6 par cont) per annum, payable semiinnually, said bonds being payable hat of a sinking fund to be created as rovided by statute, said bonds bearng such date and being in such form is chall hereafter be preparated in sald Ordinance No. 169 of said Town of Kirkhand."

Every voter at such election desiring to vote against the bald proposed system or plan, and the issuance and sale of unid bonds, shall vote a bailot containing the following statement of the said proposition, to-wit:

"AGAINST the proposition and juestica of specifying and adopting he system or plan proposed to construct, condemn and purchase, purchase, acquire, maintain and operate a system of waterworks within or without the limits of the Town o. Cirkland for the purpose of furnishng such town and the inhabitants hereof, and any other persons, with in ample supply of water for all uses and purposes, public and private, in luding waterpower and other power brived therefrom, as specified and adopted in Section Two (2) of Ordi iance No. 109 of said Town, approved Pebruary 18th, 1913, and authorizing a bonded indebteiness for the purse of providing funds for the contruction of said waterworks system and the issuance and sale of general negotiable coupon bonds of said Town of Kirkland in the sum of Eighteen Thougand Two Hundred Fifty (\$18,-250.) Dollars, payable twenty (20) years from date thereof, and bearing interest at the rate of Six (6) per ent. per annum, payalle semi-annually, said bonds being payable out of a sinking fund to be created as proided by statute, said bonds bearing such date and being in such form as shall hereafter be prescribed in said Ordinance No. 100 of said Town of Finkland."

Sec. 7. In case three fifths of the qualified voters of the Town of Kirkand, voting at said election, vote in lavor of the said cistem or plan for the said waterworks and water supply system, and the said proposition o become indebted and lesue general own bonds to meet the cost of said ystem or plan, the same shall constitute and be an ascent to and adoption- of said system or plan for said waterworks and water supply system, ind shall constitute and be an assent and authority to become indebted and sane general town bonds, as detailed n Section 5 of this ordinance, to taise revenue to meet the cost of said system or plan; said bonds to conform in all respects to the provisions of Chapter 150 of the Session Laws of 1909 of the State of Washington, and the Mayor and Town Douncil shall provide, by the necessary ordinances, for the issuance and tale of said bonds and the payment of the interest and principal thereof in actordance with the terms of said

Sec. 8. There shall be levied each year by the ocuncil of said town, in its annual tax lery, a tax upon all the property in said town subject to caration sufficient to pay the interest upon said bonds as the same accrue, and the amount of such tax, as collected, shall be by the Town Treasurer credited to a special fund for the payment of the interest upon said bonds, and no part of such fund shall be diverted to any other purpose than the payement of such interest, and the faith, credit and prop erty of the Town of Kirkland are hereby irrevocably pledged for the annual levy and collection of such tax and the regular payment of such interests, and the payment of the principal of such bonds at maturity.

Such taxes shall become due and col-lectable as other taxes.

Sec. 9. At least five (5) years prior to the maturity of said bonds and thereafter in each year until their maturity, there shall be levied by the Town Council of said town, in its annual tax lovy, a tax upon all the property in said town subject to taxannual tax lovy, a tax upon all the property in said town subject to taxation, sufficient to accumulate during said peries of years a fund equal to the principal sum of all of said bonds remaining unpaid and not ewned by said town, and the amount of such tax, as collected, shall be by the Treasurer of said town evalited to a special fund for the payment of the principal of such bends and no part of such funds shall be directed to any other purpose than the payment of such principal, and the faith, property and credit of said Town are hereby pledged for the levy and collection of such tax, and the payment of the principal of such bends at the maturity thereof; but such sinking fund, or any accumulated portion thereof, may be invested at any time or times, not less than six mentic

or times, not less than six menths price to the maturity of the said bends, in case the Tewn Council shall so direct, in any bonds issued in pursuance of this ordinance, to

in pursuance of this ordinance, to the extent only of the face amount of the principal of such bonds, or in any interest learing bonds of the United States of America, or of the State of Washington, or in any other secunties in which its investment may be

authorized by a general law of this State, in which case all interest or premiums which may be realized on any investment as well as the prince pal thereof, shall be credited to sud sink'n; fund.
Sec. 19. That said special electic shall be held and conducted as othe town elections in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinances of the Town of Kirkland and Town of Kirkland and the General Laws of the State of Washington; and the Town Clerk shall give least ten (10) days' notice of the time, place and purpose of
