ORDINANCE NO. 119

AN ORDINANCE relating to the conduct of persons and to places occupied by them while engaged as hack, automobile, taxicab, or omnibus drivers, hotel runners, steamboat runners, expressmen, or solicitors of customers or passengers, for hire, and providing a penalty for any violation thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Kirkland, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any hack, taxicab, automobile, or omnibus driver, hotel runner, steamboat runner, expressman or solicitor while engaged in such occupation and soliciting customers and passengers for hire, <sup>on</sup> ~~from~~ the ~~King~~ <sup>Dock</sup> King County Ferry, within the corporate limits of the Town of Kirkland, to occupy any other position than as follows:

To stand at any other place than within three (3) feet of said vehicle they represent and not North of the line marked by a timber 12 x 12, which divides the road or thoroughfare between the North side of said Dock used by pedestrians, and the South side, used by vehicles, and other purposes.

Section 2. Any person who shall violate this provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be fined <sup>not more than</sup> One Hundred dollars (\$100) or be imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days, or by both so fined and imprisoned.
