

ORDINANCE NO. 136.

AN ORDINANCE accepting the deed of Mary A. Lavin to a portion of Lot Eleven (11), Block Three (3), Woods' Addition to Kirkland, authorized to be acquired pursuant to Ordinance No. 120 of the Town of Kirkland, and directing the Town Clerk to draw, and the Town Treasurer to pay, a warrant upon the General Fund of said Town in the sum of Seventy-five (\$75.00) Dollars in payment therefor, which sum is hereby appropriated.

Be it ordained by the Town of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. That the deed of Mary A. Lavin dated April 24, 1914, conveying to the Town of Kirkland the following described property, to-wit:

That portion of Lot Eleven (11), Block Three (3), Woods Addition to Kirkland, King County, more particularly described as follows:

From the Southeast corner of Lot Eleven (11), Block Three (3), run North One (1) Degree, two (2) minutes, thirty (30) seconds west along the west margin of Lincoln Street, a distance of fifty (50) feet; thence South eighty-nine (89) degrees, eight (8) minutes, thirteen (13) seconds west parallel to the north margin of Willow Street, a distance of one hundred seventy (170) feet to a pipe monument; thence South one (1) degree, two (2) minutes, thirty (30) seconds East, parallel with the west margin on Lincoln Street, a distance of fifty (50) feet to the north margin of Willow Street; thence North Eighty-nine (89) degrees, eight (8) minutes, thirteen (13) seconds East, along the north line of Willow Street, a distance of one hundred and seventy feet to the point of beginning, containing therein 0.195 acres more or less;

be, and the same is, hereby accepted.

Section 2. That the Town Clerk be, and he is, hereby authorized to draw, and the Town Treasurer to pay, a warrant upon the General Fund in the sum of Seventy-five (\$75.00) Dollars in payment therefor, which sum is hereby appropriated for such purpose.
