9.	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND AS FOLLOWS:
10	Section 1. ANIMALS AT LARGE.
11	That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, company or corporation

13	to run at large within the limits of the Town of Kirkland

20	Section 2. Animals and fames, as above described, shall be deemed
21	running at large within this ordinance when off the owner's premises
22	and not within his immediate control.
23	Section 3. The Marshal of the Town of Kirkland, or any person
24	who may be appointed in writing by him, may seize and impound any
25	cattle, horse, sheep, swine, goats, for or other animals astray

Section 4. The Marshal, or any person who may be so appointed by him for the purposes may detain at the public pound or other suitable place any stray animal or fewl named in or reasonably to be considered as included within the provisions of this ordinance until the owner has substantiated his right to such animal to the satis-

faction of the Marshal, or any other person appointed by him for the purpose, or in case of dispute as to ownership before any court of competent jurisdiction, subject to the penalty, fees and costs prescribed by this ordinance. The Marshal shall be entitled to charge the owner of any impounded animal fifty (50) cents for each day or part of day from midnight it is detained for the care and feeding thereof, and shall take proper means to insure its proper care and feeding, and he shall charge an impounding fee of the (\$1.00) Dollar for each impounded animal, and them to the Town Treasury as other fines and fees are paid.

Section 6. If at the expiration of two days any impounded animal er foul shall not be released by the claimant by the payment of costs and fees herein provided, the Marshal shall proceed to give fifteen (15) days notice by one publication in the official newspaper of the Town of Kirkland, of a time and place when and where he will expose the said animal, expland, to sale by public auction, at which time and place he shall expose at public auction such animal for sale, and out of the proceedings pay all of the expenses aforesaid, and all other necessary expenses and pay the residue to the Town Treasurer. The said notice shall describe the said animal or with reasonable certainty, and shall state to whom, , if any one, the Marshal believes said animal to belong, and if the name of the owner is wholly unknown to the Marshal that fact shall be stated in said notice. If such owner shall be known to the Marshall, and can with reasonable diligence be found in the Town a copy of such notice shall be served upon him or her at least one day prior to the sale.

Section 7. In case any owner or claimant of any animal extent impounded shall apply for the release of said animal at any time before sale he shall pay in addition to the costs and

expenses heretofore provided for, all costs of publication, notice and service of notice, if any, and any other necessary expenses.

Section 8. At any time within six months from the date of the sale of any animal *** The former owner thereof, upon proper application to the Town Treasurer, and upon satisfactory proof to such Town Treasurer that he is the former owner, may receive the residue of the proceed of the sale provided for in Section 6 hereof, after deducting all costs and expenses, and if at the expiration of said six months the former owner shall not have applied to the Town Treasurer as provided for in this Section, then said Town Treasurer shall pay said residue into the general fund and delay action thereafter.

Section 9. Any person who shall hinder, delay or obstruct the Town Marshal, or any person appointed by him, for the purpose, while engaged in driving or taking to the pound any animal liable to be impounded, shall, for each such offense, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, or imprisonment in the town jail for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Section 10. Any person, firm, company or corporation who shall permit any of the animals extends mentioned in section 1 hereof to run at large in violation of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not less than ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, or imprisonment in the Town jail for a term not to exceed thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment within the discretion of the court.

Section 1D. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and its publisation; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become
