ORDINANCE NO. 159

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 139, entitled:

"An Ordinance to regulate the keeping of certain animals within the limits of the Town of Kirkland, providing for the impounding of animals found running at large in violation of this ordinance and for the sale and redemption of the same, and providing penalties for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town of Kirkland, as follows:

Sec. 1. That Section 1 be amended to read as follows:

That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, company or corporation to permit any horses, cattle, mules, swine, sheep or goats to run at large within the limits of the town of Kirkland, and that when such animals are picketed for grazing purposes upon the commons, it shall be unlawful to picket said animals in such a manner as to permit them to reach or cross streets or sidewalks or reach the fences of adjoining property.

This Ordinance to take effect the 1st day of September, 1916.
