ORDINANCE No. 189

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC DANCES AND
DANCE HALLS IN THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of
Kirkland as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person,
persons, firm or association to conduct, give or hold any
public dance in the Town of Kirkland, without first procuring
a permit or license therefor.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person
holding, giving or conducting any public dance in the Town of
Kirkland, to keep said dance open or to continue the same
after the hour of ^{twelve} twelve o'clock, midnight.

SECTION 3. No permit or license shall be issued
to any person, persons, firm or association who, in the opinion
of the Mayor, Clerk and Finance Committee will or be apt to con-
duct any dance in a disorderly manner or fashion. And before
any permit or license is issued to any person, persons, firm
or association for the holding of any public dance within the
Town of Kirkland, a fee of \$ 1.00, shall be paid
to the Town Clerk, or in his absence to the Treasurer, and a
deposit of \$ _____ shall be placed as a forfeit
in case the dance is not conducted strictly in accordance with
the terms of this ordinance.

In addition to the license fee above provided for,
there shall be paid into the Town treasury by any person, per-
sons, firm or association holding a public dance within the

Town of Kirkland, _____ per cent (_____ %) of the proceeds derived from the sale of tickets or admission to said dance.

No license fee shall be required of any person, persons, firm or association desiring to hold or conduct a public dance for any charitable cause, but a permit shall be obtained from the Town Officials, who shall be the sole judges as to whether the dance to be conducted is for legitimate or charitable cause.

SECTION 4. Any one who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$100.00.
