

ORDINANCE NO 194

AN ORDINANCE providing for the improvement of
by buildy a four foot wooden walk

Richmond st

and creating local improvement District therefor, and providing for the payment of said improvement by special assessment upon the property in said district, all in accordance with Resolution No. 85 of the Town Council of the Town of Kirkland.

BE IT ORDAINED By the Town Council of the Town of Kirkland, as follows:

Sec. 1. That *Richmond Street from Market Street to Lake Ave.* be improved by *buildy a four foot wooden side walk on the north east side* and that such other work be done as may be necessary in connection therewith according to the plans and specifications thereof prepared under the instruction of the Town Engineer.

Sec. 2. That the cost and expense of said improvement including all necessary and incidental expenses shall be borne and assessed against the property included in the assessment district hereinafter created, in accordance with the law.

Sec. 3. That there is hereby established, a Local Improvement District to be called Local Improvement District No. 52-B which said district is described as follows:

"All the property between the termini of said improvement, abutting upon, adjacent or approximate to said portion of said street to a distance back from the marginal lines thereof as provided by law."

Sec. 4. Warrants bearing interest at the rate of seven per cent per annum shall be issued in payment of the cost and expense of this improvement, which warrants shall be redeemed and paid by the collection of special assessments to be levied and assessed upon the property within the Local Improvement District provided for herein, said assessment to be immediately due and payable upon the hearing and confirmation of the assessment roll.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
