ORDINANCE NO. 277

An Ordinance regulating the keeping of dynamite, caps, or other explosives dangerous to the public, and hauling or transporting the same.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND.

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to keep, hold, or have in storage within the limits of the town of Kirkland, any dynamite, caps, nitro-glycerine, or other explosive which is inflammable, or combustable by friction or concussion, in excess of 50 pounds of dynamite or five thousand caps, or other powder or explosive of equal strength for retail ^{or other purposes} purposes.

Section 2: Any person hauling, transporting, or carrying dynamite, powder, caps or other explosives containing nitro-glycerine through the town of Kirkland is hereby required to carry, in a conspicuous place on the rear and sides of the truck, car, or other vehicle carrying such explosives, a sign with the word "Explosives" in red letters, and comply with all the requirements of the state or county regulating such transportation.

Section 3: This ordinance is not to be construed as placing any limits on the State of Washington, or the United States in storing or transporting explosives or munitions of war.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

NOTICE TO BIDDERS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT SEALED BIDS WILL BE RECEIVED by the undersigned Town Clerk of the Town of Kirkland for the improvement of Commercial Street by laying a six inch water main on Commercial Street from Lake Avenue to the State Aid Road and such other work as may be necessary thereto in accordance with Ordinance No. 249 of the Town of Kirkland and the following streets: from Oxford on Jefferson to Market to connect with the new main on Columbia, from Oxford on Washington to Market, from Columbia to Marion on Market, from Market to Juanita on Spring, from Spring to Marion on Juanita from Juanita to Market on Marion, and such other work as may be necessary in connection therewith and in accordance with Ordinance No. 272.

Said bids will be received up to 5:00 o'clock P.M. December 21, 1925 at the office of the Town Clerk. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check for ten per-cent of the amount of the bid made payable to the Town of Kirkland and the same to be forfeited to the said Town in case the successful bidder fails to enter into a contract and furnish a bond as required and provided for.

The successful bidder will be required to enter into a written contract pursuant to said bid and furnish a good and sufficient bond to the said Town conditioned for the faithful performance thereof, in an amount equal to the contract price for said work, all within ten days after the acceptance of said bid.

The town council reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

The successful bidder will also be required to make all payments to the State of Washington, which may be required to be made by reason of the Workmen's Compensation Act.

Special attention is called to the number of hours constituting a days work under the State Law.

Proposals must be endorsed: "Bid on Laying water main on Commercial Street and such other streets as specified under Ordinance No. 272."
