ORDINANCE 292

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance 105 of the Town of Kirkland.

Be it Ordained by the Town of Kirkland as follows:-

Section I. That Ordinance No. 105 shall read as follows. An Ordinance making it unlawful for any person firm or Corporation to have or keep within or under his, her, or its control, as owner, or otherwise, any billiard, pool, card table, or bowling alley or any other games of chance or science for hire within the Corporate limits of the Town of Kirkland without first procuring a License therefore as in this Ordinance hereinafter provided.

Section E. Section I of Ordinance shall read as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person firm or Corporation to he have or keep within the Corporate Limits of the Town of Kirkland, as owner or otherwise, any billiard, pool tables, cardetables or bowling alleys on which billiards, pool, cards, or bowling are played for hire or for any consideration whatsoever, particle by the players directly or indirectly to the owner or owners thereof.

Section 3. Section 2, of said Ordinance shall read as follows:

Any person firm or Corporation desiring to keep any pool, billiard or camed table, or operate a bowling alley on which games are played for hire, or any consideration whatsoever, paid directly or indirectly to the owner or person in charge thereof, shall first procure a license as here in provided.

For each pool or biliard table the sum of $\frac{525}{per}$ per year.

For each card table the sum of $\frac{5}{100}$ per year.

For each bowling alley the sum of \$25 per year. per alley

Said License shall be paid to the Town Clerk when authorized by the Town Council, and be dated as of the first day of March of each year, and shall remain in like manner.

Section 3. That Section 3 of Ordinance 105 shall read as follows:- Any person firm or Corporation violating any of the provisions shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine not to exceed \$50.00 or less than \$10.00
