

ORDINANCE NO. 380

AN ORDINANCE of the Town of Kirkland, providing for the construction of a water tank, providing for the method of payment, and authorizing the Clerk to call for bids.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND:

SECTION 1. That the Town of Kirkland will construct a reinforced concrete tank of 100,000 gallons capacity on Lots 6 and 17, Block 175, Map of Kirkland, together with connections thereto from the existing six inch (6") Main in second street at Seventh Avenue, and including an overflow drain, together with such other work as may be necessary in connection therewith, all in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by the Town Engineer.

SECTION 2. That the entire cost and expense of said improvement, including all necessary and incidental expenses, shall be borne by the Water Fund of the Town of Kirkland in accordance with the law.

SECTION 3. Warrants bearing interest at the rate of <sup>6%</sup> ~~7%~~ per annum shall be issued in payment of the cost and expense of this improvement, and shall be redeemed in cash from the revenues of the Water Department. The warrants in payment for all work done shall be issued and delivered to the contractor on the estimate of the Town Engineer.

SECTION 4. That the Clerk is hereby authorized to call for bids on the construction of said tank and connections and overflow drain and material, all in accordance with the plans and specifications of the Town Engineer.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
