ORDINANCE NO. 388

AN ORDINANCE of the Town of Kirkland regulating the speed of motor vehicles within the Town of Kirkland, and designating the points where vehicles should come to a stop before entering certain streets, and authorizing the street committee to place suitable signs at the entrance of such streets, and providing a penalty for violation of this ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation, to operate any motor vehicle within the limits of the town of Kirkland at a speed exceeding twenty-five miles per hour, and at the following intersections at a speed exceeding fifteen miles per hour, to-wit: at the intersection of Kirkland Avenue and Lake Avenue, the intersection of Lake Avenue and Central Way, the intersection of Lake Avenue and Market Street.

SECTION 2: Every person firm or corporation operating a motor vehicle within the Town of Kirkland shall come to a complete stop before entering Lake Avenue, Market Street, or Central Way, East of Lake Avenue.

SECTION 3: The street committee of the Town of Kirkland is hereby authorized to place suitable stop signs or regulation signs at the intersection of such streets and such other points as in their judgment is to the best interest of public safety and convenience of the public in regulating traffic.

SECTION 4: Any person firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum of not less than two dollars or more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment for not ~~less than~~ more than thirty days or by such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage publication and approval as provided by law.
