ORDINANCE NO. 400.

An Ordinance regulating the maintenance, hanging or suspension of signs, banners or advertising devices across the streets, alleys or public ways of the Town of Kirkland; and providing a penalty for the violation of its provisions.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any individual, firm or corporation to maintain, hang or in any manner suspend any sign, banner or advertising device upon, over or across any street, alley or public way of the Town of Kirkland in any way so that the same or any part thereof shall be less than eight feet above the sidewalk (or where there is no side walk, then above the street level) or which shall project more than eight feet from the margin of such street, alley or public way. Provided, however, that the Day Marshall shall have, and is hereby granted, authority to grant a special permit to an applicant to suspend an advertising banner across any such street, alley or public way, for a specified limited time.

Section 2. Any individual, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions hereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than One dollars or more than Twenty-five dollars.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in the manner provided by law.
