ORDINANCE NO. 425

An Ordinance regulating the operation of pin ball and crane amusement devices, penny-counter amusement devices, punch boards, pool tables and card tables and providing licenses and penalties for the operation of the same.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND:

The following licenses shall be paid to the clerk of the City of Kirkland by all persons desiring the privilege of operating the amusement devices herein further to be described. Said licenses shall be paid in advance on the first day of July, 1938 and monthly or yearly thereafter as herein provided. No minors shall be permitted to use any of the following described devices.

- I
- Pin ball machines and crane amusement devices License \$5.00 per month.
- II
- Penny-counter amusement device License \$1.00 per month.
- III
- Merchandising punch boards only 5% of the gross receipts.
- IV
- Pool tables Each \$10.00 per year, payable on the first day of July of each year.
- V
- Card tables Each \$10.00 per year, payable on the first day of July of each year.

The number of pin ball amusement devices to be operated in the City of Kirkland shall at no time exceed seven (7).

The number of crane amusement devices to be operated in the City of Kirkland shall at no time exceed five (5).

The number of penny-counter amusement devices to be operated in the City of Kirkland shall at no time exceed six (6).

Any person violating the foregoing provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction therefore shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and in addition shall have their license revoked for the operation of any of the above devices for such period of time as the court may direct.
