

Ordinance No. 427

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OTHER THAN ONE OF THOSE ENUMERATED IN REMINGTON'S REVISED STATUTES, SECTION 900-6 WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE BUDGET FOR THE YEAR 1938 AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$1285.00 DOLLARS TOWARDS THE PURCHASE OF REAL PROPERTY FOR CEMETERY PURPOSES.

The City Council of the City of Kirkland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas it has become necessary and expedient, to increase the cemetery facilities for the City of Kirkland.

Whereas it has been estimated that the cost to the City for purchasing real property for that purpose is \$1285.00 Dollars.

Section 2. That there be and there hereby is appropriated, in addition to the amount of the budget for the year 1938, the sum of \$1285.00 out of the general fund for the purpose of paying the cost of purchasing the following described real property for cemetery purposes:

Lot 8, Block 10, Burke and Farrar's Kirkland Addition to the City of Seattle, Division No. 6, according to plat recorded in Volume 19 of Plats, page 68 records of said county, situated in King County, Washington.

Section 3. The City Council of the City of Kirkland does hereby declare that they have found an emergency to exist.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall not be passed until one week after its introduction and it shall require the unanimous vote of the councilmen present and the approval of the Mayor.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days from and after its passage, approval and legal publication.
