ORDINANCE NO. 440

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OTHER THAN ONE OF THOSE ENUMERATED IN REMINGTON'S REVISED STATUTES, SECTION 9000-6, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE BUDGET FOR 1940 AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$ 1121.71 TOWARDS THE PURCHASE AND REPAIR OF A CITY HALL FOR CITY PURPOSES.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I The premises on the North East corner of Market Street and Central Avenue in the City of Kirkland, used by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as Council Chambers and as the office for the Clerk, have been rendered impractical due to the condition and state of disrepair of said building. Said premises were tenanted by the City on a month to month basis. A notice of cessation of tenancy to the City would have created a serious emergency that could not be remedied without considerable loss and damage to the City. It is necessary that certain premises now occupied by the City on the South West corner of Central Avenue and Market Street be purchased and repaired for the use of the City Council of the City of Kirkland.

Section II Such a state of facts could not reasonably have been foreseen when the City's Budget for 1940 was adopted.

Section IV This ordinance shall not be passed until one week after its introduction and shall require the unanimous vote of the Councilmen present and the approval of the Mayor.
