

ORDINANCE NO. 446

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ERECTION AND MAINTAINANCE OF BILLBOARDS AND PROVIDING A LICENSE FOR THE ERECTION AND MAINTAINANCE OF THE SAME AND PROVIDING PENALTIES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND:

Sec. 1: There shall be paid to the Clerk of the City of Kirkland, by all persons erecting or maintaining a billboard or billboards within the city of Kirkland, the sum of \$10.00 per year for each billboard so erected, or maintained. Said license fee shall be paid in advance on the second day of January of each year and yearly thereafter as herein provided.

For the calendar year 1941, a license fee in the sum of \$ 7.50, shall be paid on or before the 1st day of May, 1941, for each and every billboard erected or maintained within the City of Kirkland.

- Sec. 2: For the purpose of this ordinance a billboard shall be defined as any outdoor board or structure having a surface area of 100 square feet or more, having thereon words, figures, pictures or symbols with respect to the advertising of any commodities sold or to be sold, or any services rendered or to be rendered by any person, or for the purpose of placing the name of any person, persons or corporation before the public, or for the purpose of acquainting the public with the existence of or the business of, or the services performed by said person, persons or corporation.

Sec. 3: A. Any person or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not more than \$50.00, and the failure

to pay for each billboard erected or maintained as herein provided for, shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.
