

ORDINANCENO. 478

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON, DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OTHER THAN THOSE ENUMERATED IN REMINGTON'S REVISED STATUTES, SECTION 9000-6, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE BUDGET FOR 1943, AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$8400.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF OPERATING AND MAINTAINING THE SEWER SYSTEM IN AND FOR THE CITY OF KIRKLAND.

The City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

That whereas the City of Kirkland is constructing and establishing a complete sewer system in and for said City and certain territory immediately adjacent thereto, and

WHEREAS, during the course of this construction the City has been called upon to alter the design for the sewer disposal plant in accordance with the wishes of the War Production Board, and the plant so altered will require more labor and operating costs to operate than the plant originally designed, and

WHEREAS, these additional operating expenses could not reasonably have been anticipated at the time the 1943 budget for the City of Kirkland was adopted, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the health and safety of the residents of the City of Kirkland that the sewer system be maintained and operated,

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council does hereby find that an emergency exists for the appropriation provided for herein. There is hereby appropriated for the City of Kirkland the sum of \$ 8400.00 to pay for the following items:
