

ORDINANCENo. 484

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS
FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS, there exists within the City of Kirkland a number of dwelling houses and commercial establishments which have yet to connect with the Kirkland Sewer System, and

WHEREAS, many of these connections must be made within the City Streets of the City of Kirkland, and

WHEREAS, the making of these connections will disturb the City Streets of the City of Kirkland, and

WHEREAS, a uniform policy should be adhered to and uniform regulations should apply to the making of each of said connections,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY REQUIRED That no person shall be permitted to disturb the City Streets of the City of Kirkland for the purpose of making a sewer connection therein unless such person has, previous to the performance of said work, secured from the City Clerk of the City of Kirkland a permit to perform said work. Said permit shall be issued subject to such conditions as the Street Commissioner in and for the City of Kirkland shall require.

Section 11. The tax hereby levied and imposed shall be collected and paid on and after May 1, 1943.

Section 12. If any portion of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the portions which are not adjudged invalid.

Section 13. Each violation of or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense and shall subject the offender to a fine of not to exceed Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) or to imprisonment in the City Jail for not to exceed ninety (90) days, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
