ORDINANCE

No. 486

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A  
 PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN REMINGTON'S REVISED  
 STATUTES SECTION 9000-6, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY  
 HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE BUDGET FOR THE YEAR  
 1943, AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$3000.00 plus interest AND AUTHORIZING  
 IMMEDIATE EXPENDITURE OF SAID SUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF REDEEMING CER-  
 TAIN EMERGENCY WATER DEPARTMENT WARRANTS ISSUED BY THE CITY OF  
 KIRKLAND IN 1941

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland has heretofore in the year  
 1941, by Ordinance No. 445, issued emergency warrants in the sum of  
 Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) upon the Water Fund in and for  
 the City of Kirkland, and

WHEREAS, provision was made in the Budget for 1942 for the re-  
 payment of said warrants, and

WHEREAS, through oversight said payment was not made pursuant  
 to said Budget, and said payment was not rebudgeted for the year  
 1943, and

WHEREAS, said warrants are drawing interest at the expense of  
 the Water Department Fund, and sufficient money exists in the funds  
 of said Water Department for the payment of said emergency warrants,

NOW, THEREFORE, An emergency expenditure in an amount not to  
 exceed \$3000.00 plus interest be and the same hereby is authorized for the purpose  
 of paying for said emergency warrants, together with the interest  
 accumulated thereon.

This Ordinance shall not be passed until one (1) week after its  
 introduction, and shall require the unanimous vote of the Councilmen  
 present and the approval of the Mayor.

Introduced this 20th day of Sept, 1943.

Passed and approved this 18th day of October, 1943.
