ORDINANCE

No. 488

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND FIXING THE SALARY
FOR THE CLERK OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, AND REPEALING
ORDINANCE NO. 417, ORDINANCE NO. 472, ORDINANCE NO. 473,
AND ORDINANCE NO. 422

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO CRDAIN AS
FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the salary of the Clerk of the City of Kirkland shall be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$2,600.00) per annum, payable in equal monthly installments.

Section 2. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 417 which reads as follows: "The salary of the Clerk of the Town of Kirkland shall be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Hundred Twenty Five Dollars per year (\$225.00), payable in equal monthly installments." is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Ordinances Nos. 472, 473, and 422 are hereby repealed in their entirety.

Section 4. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the 5th day of June, 1944.
