ORDINANCE

No. 495

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN REMINGTON'S REVISED STATUTES SECTION 9000-6, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE BUDGET FOR 1944, AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$467.30, AND AUTHORIZING IMMEDIATE EXPENDITURE OF SAID SUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING FOR THE USE AND BENEFIT OF THE CITY SEWER DEPARTMENT IN AND FOR THE CITY OF KIRKLAND A SLUDGE DISINTEGRATOR.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS an emergency exists which affects the health and welfare of the population of the City of Kirkland in that the City of Kirkland is without means or facilities for treating and disintegrating the sludge to be hereinafter removed from the sludge bed of the City of Kirkland's sewer treatment plant, and

MEMERAS, said Sewer Department could not reasonably have foreseen that a mechanical sludge disintegrator would be required in connection with the efficient utilization of the Kirkland sewer treatment plant, and the City of Kirkland has not heretofore budgeted sufficient funds for the Sewer Department Betterment Fund to acquire a sludge disintegrator, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DOES HEREBY FIND That an emergency exists for the appropriation of the sum of \$\frac{3}467.30\$ for the purchase of a mechanical sludge disintegrator, Model FSH, from the Western Foundary Sand Company of Seattle, Washington. There is hereby appropriated for the Sewer Department of the City of Kirkland the sum of \$467.30 to pay for said disintegrator.

It is further ordained that said payment for said purpose be made forthwith.

. This ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and welfare of the residents of the City of Kirkland.

This ordinance shall not be passed until one week after its introduction and shall require the unanimous vote of the Councilmen present and the approval of the Mayor.
