

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN REM. REV. STAT. SECTION 9000-8, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF THE MAKING OF THE BUDGET FOR THE YEAR 1946, AND APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$10,000.00, AND AUTHORIZING THE IMMEDIATE EXPENDITURE OF SAID SUM FOR THE USE AND BENEFIT OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING A CERTAIN 1945 BUFFALO FIRE TRUCK FOR SAID CITY OF KIRKLAND.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS, an emergency exists which affects the health and welfare of the population of the City of Kirkland in that the City of Kirkland is in immediate need of additional fire-fighting equipment, in order to adequately protect life and limb in the city of Kirkland, and

WHEREAS, said City Council of the City of Kirkland has heretofore called for bids for the purchase of a fire-fighting truck and said bids have been submitted and said City Council has selected a bid net to the City of thirteen thousand fifteen Dollars (\$13,015.00) for a certain 1945 Buffalo Fire Truck, and

WHEREAS, it could not have been reasonable foreseen at the time the 1946 budget was adopted for the City of Kirkland that said fire-fighting equipment was necessary or requisite,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DOES HEREBY find that an emergency exists for the appropriation of the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), to be paid, together with other funds, for the purchase of said fire truck. There is hereby appropriated from the General fund of the City of Kirkland the said sum for the purpose of purchasing said equipment.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That the payment of said sum for said purpose be made so soon as necessary. This Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and for the welfare of the residents of the City of Kirkland.

This Ordinance shall not be passed until one week after its introduction and shall require the unanimous vote of the Councilman present

and the approval of the Mayor.
