ORDINANCE

No. 524

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN REM. REV. STAT. SECTION 9000-6, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF THE MAKING OF THE BUDGET FOR THE YEAR 1946, and APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$ 1.143.05 AND AUTHORIZING THE IMMEDIATE EXPENDITURE OF SAID SUM FOR THE USE AND BENEFIT OF THE PARK DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS, an emergency exists which affects the health and
welfare of the population of the City of Kirkland in that the City of
Kirkland has recently acquired what was formerly the United States
Naval Barracks at Kirkland, for Park purposes and said barracks has
necessiated the immediate expenditure of funds over and above the
amount of funds budgeted in the Park Department in the City of Kirkland
for the year 1946 in order to adequately serve the health and welfare
needs of the City of Kirkland and,

WHEREAS, it could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time the 1946 budget was adopted for the City of Kirkland that said additional expenditures would be necessitated.

NOW, THEREFORE, the CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DOES

HEREBY FIND that an emergency does exist for the appropriation of

\$\frac{1,143.03}{2}\$ from the general fund of the City of Kirkland

for the Park Department of said City for the maintenance and operation

of the facilities of said Park Department and that sum is hereby

appropriated from the general fund of the City of Kirkland for said

purpose.

IT IS FURTHER FOUND That this ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and for the welfare of the residents of the City of Kirkland.

This ordinance shall not be passed until one week after its introduction and shall require the unanimous vote of the Councilmen present and the approval of the Mayor.
