

ORDINANCE NO. 540

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN REMINGTON'S REVISED STATUTES, SECTION 9000-6, which said emergency could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the budget for 1947, and appropriating the sum of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) and authorizing the immediate expenditure of said sum for the purpose of acquiring lights for the Civic Center Playfield, constructing bleachers thereon, and operating the Park Department of the City of Kirkland.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS an emergency exists which effects the health and welfare of the population of the City of Kirkland, in that a complete lighting system is necessary immediately for the ball field and public playground at the City Park located at the Civic Center in said City of Kirkland, and it is necessary that bleachers be constructed thereon immediately to adequately serve the needs of the citizens of said city, and further funds are necessary to maintain the Park Department of said City of Kirkland for the balance of the fiscal year of 1947,

AND WHEREAS, said Park Department could not reasonably have foreseen the necessity of said expenditure at the time of the preparation of the budget for the fiscal year of 1947, and the adoption thereof by the City Council, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DOES HEREBY FIND that an emergency exists for the appropriation of the sum of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) to be used for said uses and purposes, and there is hereby appropriated for the Park Department of the said City of Kirkland, the sum of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00). It is further ordained that the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) be transferred from the Water Fund of the City of Kirkland as a loan from said Water Department to be re-paid to said department, together with interest thereon at the rate of two per centum (2%) per annum during the fiscal year of 1948.

This Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of health and the welfare of the residents and citizens of the City of Kirkland, and is hereby declared to be in full force and effect immediately.

Introduced and emergency declared and this Ordinance passed and approved this 15th day of September, 1947.
