AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL MEAT SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE OR RESALE, EXPOSED FOR SALE FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, TO HAVE BEEN INSPECTED PREVIOUSLY, DECLARING ANY VIOLATION THEREOF TO BE A MISDEMEANOR, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. MEAT INSPECTION, WHEN REQUIRED. All meat sold, offered for sale or resale, or exposed for sale for human consumption in the City of Kirkland shall bear either a city, state, or federal inspection and passed stamp. In inspecting and stamping meat, the standards prescribed by the United States Bureau of Animal Industry, United States Department of Agriculture, as amended, shall govern, except with respect to a farmer bona fide killing his own production on his own premises for his own use. A farmer killing his own production on his own farm who has a state permit from the State Director of Agriculture can present such meat for inspection either at a fully licensed slaughterhouse or at a point designated by the King County Health Department at which inspection is maintained. The head, liver, lungs, and kidneys attached to the carcass by their natural attachments must be presented at the inspection point.

Section 2. PENALTY. Violation of or failure to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall subject the offender to a fine in any sum not to exceed Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), or to imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

Section 3. ENFORCEMENT OF. The enforcement of this ordinance is hereby delegated by the City of Kirkland to King County.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days from and after its passage, approval, and legal publication as provided by law.
