

ORDINANCE NO. 558

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN REMINGTON'S REVISED STATUTES, SECTION 9000-6, which said emergency could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the budget for 1948, and appropriating the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) and authorizing the immediate expenditure of said sum for the purpose of acquiring chairs for the Civic Center Auditorium paying a deficit, and providing fuel, light, and up-keep of the Kirkland Civic Center in excess of the estimated costs of the operation of said Civic Center.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS an emergency exists which affects the health and welfare of the population of the City of Kirkland, in that the Civic Center cannot be fully utilized without the acquisition of seats or chairs, and it is necessary to purchase chairs to adequately serve the needs of the citizens of Kirkland, and further that funds are necessary to pay a deficit and to maintain and operate the Civic Center of the City of Kirkland for the balance of the fiscal year of 1948,

AND WHEREAS, the Park Department could not reasonably have foreseen the necessity of said expenditure at the time of the preparation of the budget for the fiscal year of 1948, and the adoption thereof by the City Council, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DOES HEREBY FIND that an emergency exists for the appropriation of the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) to be used for said uses and purposes, and there is hereby appropriated for the Park Department of the City of Kirkland for the specified uses in connection with the Kirkland Civic Center, the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00). It is further ordained that the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) be transferred from the General Fund of the City of Kirkland as a loan from said General Fund to be repaid to that Fund, together with interest thereon at the rate of two per cent (2%) per annum during the fiscal year of 1949.

This Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the Public health and welfare of the residents and citizens of the City of

Kirkland, and is hereby declared to be in full force and effect immediately.

Introduced and emergency declared and this Ordinance passed and approved this 28th day of June, 1948.
