ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES FOR SEEING-EYE DOGS WITHOUT THE PAYMENT OF ANY LICENSE FEE BY THE OWNER THEREOF

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

That any dog used as a seeing-eye dog for the assistance of any blind or incapacitated person is hereby specifically exempted from the payment of any fee for a license by the City of Kirkland; that upon application by or on behalf of the owner of said dog, a license in the usual form shall be issued with the additional notation that said dog is a seeing-eye dog and said license ~~is~~ issued without charge.

Section 2.

That all other established rates and charges relating to dogs or licenses therefor shall be and remain unchanged.

Section 3.

This ordinance shall take effect five days from and after its passage by the Council, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.
