	WHEREAS, the central goal of the Housing Element of the Comprehensive Plan is to preserve neighborhood quality while providing housing for a variety of incomes, ages and lifestyles; and
	WHEREAS, the data from the 2014 American Community Survey shows that 69% of those who work in Kirkland come from outside the City and 73% of Kirkland's residents with jobs commute to areas outside of the City, contributing to regional traffic congestion; and
	WHEREAS, less than 25% of City of Kirkland employees, including our police officers and firefighters, live in the City of Kirkland; and
	WHEREAS, the Housing Element of the Comprehensive Plan includes goals and policies to achieve that purpose; and
	WHEREAS, the adopted goals and policies in the Comprehensive Plan do not tell us precisely how to create the kind of community envisioned by the Plan; and
	WHEREAS, the Implementation Strategies in the Comprehensive Plan identify a variety of mechanisms that will promote the actions necessary for implementation, including adopting an updated housing strategy plan and work program by 2020; and
	WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to involve representative stakeholders from throughout the community to advise the Council on housing strategies and actions to be included in the strategy plan.
