ordinance no. 689

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON, GRANTING A PERMIT FOR THE USE OF CERTAIN SPECIFICALLY DESCRIBED PROPERTY BY THE PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY EXCLUSIVELY, IN CONNECTION WITH THE SUBMARINE CABLE BEING LAID IN LAKE WASHINGTON AS PART OF THE NATIONAL DEFENSE PROGRAM OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A permit is hereby granted to the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company for the erection of a small building on the following described real property:

Beginning at the stone monument which is the intersection of the center line of NE 108th Place, formerly Lake Avenue and the center line of NE 104th Street, formerly Los Angeles Street, as shown on the plat of Burke & Farrar's Kirkland Addition to the City of Seattle, Division No. 29, according to the plat thereof recorded in Volume 25 of Plats, page 29 records of King County, Washington; thence South 41°46'15" West along the center line of said NE 108th Place, formerly Lake Avenue, a distance of 229.82 feet; thence North 82°54'45" West a distance of 146.93 feet; thence North 7°35'15" East a distance of 74.01 feet; thence North 18°50'15" East a distance of 94.07 feet; thence North 24°00'15" East a distance of 94.07 feet; thence North 16°48'15" East a distance of 121.75 feet; thence North 82°54'45" West to a point which is 60 feet easterly of the present shore line of Lake Washington, which is the true point of beginning;

Thence North 16°48'15" East a distance of 20.29 feet; thence North 82°54'45" West to the inner harbor line; thence south westerly along the inner harbor line to a point which bears North 82°54'45" West from the true point of beginning; thence south 82°54'45" East to the true point of beginning.

King County, Washington.

Section 2. The permit hereby granted is for the construction of what is known as a repeater building in connection with the submarine cable being laid in Lake Washington as part of the National Defense Program of the United States Government. The permit is granted with approval of adjoining property owners and upon the condition that upon cessation of the specific use for which the permit is granted the title to the property will revert to its original owner and existing R-l zoning or such other zoning as may have been imposed in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington and the ordinances of the City of Kirkland, will be and remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect five (5) days from and after its passage by the Council, approval by the Mayor and its publication according to law.
