ORDINANCE NO. 713

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN THE REVISED CODE OF WASHINGTON, SECTION 35.33.080, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE BUDGET FOR 1957, AND APPROPRI-ATING THE SUM OF <u>Hereford for Hundred Fortu-Lift and 07/00</u> - (3668.07) AND AUTHORIZING THE IMMEDIATE EXPENDITURE OF SAID SUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING EXTRA CHARGES AND COSTS WHICH MUST BE IMMEDIATELY PAID IN CONNECTION WITH LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 96 OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

THAT WHEREAS an emergency exists which affects the health and welfare of the population of the City of Kirkland and requires funds for the immediate preservation of order and public health in that Local Improvement District No. 96 of the City of Kirkland cannot be completed without the payment of certain funds in excess of all legally possible assessments, and it is necessary that such amounts be paid and the Local Improvement District No. 96 completed in order to adequately serve the needs of the citizens of Kirkland, and additional funds in the amount of $\frac{\#3.668.07}{...}$,) are necessary to pay said expenses and must be paid immediately;

AND WHEREAS the necessity of said expenditure could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the preparation of the budget for the fiscal year of 1957, and the appropriation therefor by the City Council, now_0 therefore,

to that Fund without interest during the fiscal year of 1958.

This Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and welfare of the residents and citizens of the City of Kirkland, and is hereby declared to be in full force and effect immediately.
