ORDINANCE NO. 721

9

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON, DECLARING THAT THERE EXISTS A PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE CHARACTER ENUMERATED IN THE REVISED CODE OF WASHINGTON, SECTION 35.33.090, WHICH SAID EMERGENCY COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE BEEN FORESEEN AT THE TIME OF MAKING THE BUDGET FOR 1957, APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF NOT TO EXCEED \$20,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF COMPLETING THE SURFACING OF STATE STREET, AND THIRD STREET FROM KIRKLAND AVENUE TO COMMERCIAL AVENUE, BOTH WITHIN THE CITY, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF WARRANTS FOR SUCH PURPOSES, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF SUCH WARRANTS.

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the City of Kirkland requiring the immediate completion of the surfacing of State Street in the city with asphaltic concrete and further requires the completion of the resurfacing of Third Street in the city from Commercial Avenue to Kirkland Avenue, and it is necessary that such work be done to adequately serve the needs of the citizens of Kirkland; and

WHEREAS, additional funds in the amount of not to exceed \$20,000 are necessary to pay the expenses thereof for the balance of the fiscal year of 1957; and

WHEREAS, the said emergency is of the character enumerated in the Revised Code of Washington, Section 35.33.090, and the same and the necessity of said expenditures could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the preparation of the budget for the fiscal year of 1957, and the appropriations therefor by the City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. For the reasons above set forth, it is hereby found and declared that an emergency exists requiring the expenditure of not to exceed \$20,000 of the funds of the City of Kirkland for said purposes, and there is hereby appropriated for the general government of the City of Kirkland and specifically for the immediate completion of the surfacing of the unpaved portion of State Street in the city with crushed rock and asphaltic concrete and the completion of the surfacing of all of State Street by a second lift of asphaltic concrete and for the completion of the surfacing of Third Street in the said city from Commercial Avenue to Kirkland Avenue, the sum of not to exceed \$20,000.

Section 2. The said \$20,000, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, shall be paid by the issuance of Current Expense Fund warrants of the City of Kirkland, which warrants shall bear interest at not to exceed 5% per annum. The principal of and interest on said warrants shall be paid from any moneys of the city deposited in its Current Expense Fund.

Section 3. This ordinance is declared to be one necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety of the people of the City of Kirkland, Washington. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance is hereby declared to be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
