ORDINANCE NO. 798

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON INCREASING WATER RATES AND CHARGES TO CUSTOMERS IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO INCREASE REVENUES NOT TO EXCEED \$62,000.00 ANNUALLY.

WHEREAS the City of Kirkland has made commitments to the City of Seattle to purchase Seattle water and the City of Seattle is presently installing main extensions to furnish such water, and

WHEREAS the City of Kirkland has contracted for certain improvements to the water transmission lines and distribution system of the City of Kirkland, and

WHEREAS the City of Kirkland is presently negotiating for the sale of revenue bonds for securing money to improve the water system of the City of Kirkland and secure Seattle water and in order to sell such bonds and make such improvements, increased revenues are needed, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Water rates and charges to users shall be increased in amounts sufficient to raise additional annual revenue of not to exceed \$62,000.00.

Section 2. The schedule of increases in water rates and charges to particular users shall be determined by a rate survey to be made between the date hereof and July 1, 1960.

Section 3: The new rate schedules as hereafter to be determined by the rate survey shall be specifically determined by the City Council and shall be established as the water service charges of the City of Kirkland on the date of conversion to the use of Seattle water.
