ORDINANCE No. 305

An Ordinance of the City of Kirkland, Washington, vacating that portion of that certain unopened street being

"That portion of deeded right-of-way lying between Tract Ten (10), Plat of South Kirkland Acreages, recorded in Volume 11 of Plats, Page 94, records of King County, Washington, and the westerly right-of-way line of the Nowhern Pacific Railroad which lies South of the easterly production of the north line of said Tract Ten (10) and north of the easterly production of the south line of said Tract Ten (10) in Kirkland, King County, Washington."

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 459 of the City of Kirkland, the City Council of said City of Kirkland set the date of the 20 day of 20, 1960, for a hearing upon the proposed vacation of that certain unopened street lying between Tract Ten (10) Plat of South Kirkland Acreages, recorded in Volume 11 of Plats, Page 94, records of King County, Washington, and the westerly right-of-way line of the Northern Pacific Railroad which lies south of the easterly production of the north line of said Tract Ten (10) and north of the easterly production of the south line of said Tract Ten (10) in Kirkland, and

WHEREAS, it appears desirable and to the best interests of the City and the property owners concerned that said portion of said unopened Street be vacated,

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

SECTION I. That the following specifically described portion of street be and the same hereby is vacated:

"That portion of deeded right-of-way lying between Tract Ten (10), Plat of South Kirkland Acreages, recorded in Volume 11 of Plats, Page 94, records of King County, Washington, and the Westerly right-of-way line of the Northern Pacific Railroad which lies south of the easterly production of the north line of said Tract Ten (10) and north of the easterly production of the south line of said Tract Ten (10) situate in Kirkland, King County, Washington."

SECTION II. That this Ordinance shall be in force and take effect five (5) days from and after its passage by the Council, approval by the Mayor and posting according to law.
