CITY OF KIRKLAND

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ESTABLISHING A MUNICIPAL ARTS COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AND PROVIDING THE DUTIES AND POWERS THEREOF;

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: There is hereby established a Municipal Art Commission to act in an advisory capacity to the City government of the City of Kirkland in connection with the artistic and cultural development of the City. The members on such commission shall be in proportion to the population, but shall consist of not less than five nor more than fifteen members to be appointed by the Mayor. At least two shall be lay members and others shall preferably include members from each of the following arts and professions: painting, sculpture, music, literature, architecture and landscape architecture. The Mayor shall solicit suggested nominations for such appointments from architectural, art, medical, literary, educational, music and other cultural organizations for the non-lay members.

Section 2: Initial appointments to such commission shall be for one, two and three-year terms with one-third of the term expiring each year, and thereafter all appointments shall be for three year terms, provided that any vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term.

Section 3: Members shall serve without compensation from the City, or from any trust, donation or legacy to the City for their service as such members, provided, however, that limitation shall

not, except as otherwise provided by state law, proclaim a number or his firm from receiving compensation from the city under contract or otherwise, for services rendered outside his duties as a ~~commissioner~~.

Section 4. The ~~commissioner~~ shall organize and adopt a chosen annually and adopt such administrative procedures as are necessary to accomplish the purposes mentioned in Section 1. City officers and the staff of city departments may consult and advise with the ~~commissioner~~ from time to time on matters coming within the scope of this ordinance, and the ~~commissioner~~ may likewise consult and advise with such officers.

Section 5. No work of art shall be contracted for or placed on property of the city or become the property of the city by purchase, gift, or otherwise, except for a ~~sum~~ or gallery. Such work of art, or design or model of the same as required by the ~~commissioner~~, together with the proposed location of such work of art shall first have been submitted to the ~~commissioner~~ for its recommendation to the city government. The term "work of art" as used in this ordinance shall comprise paintings, mural decoration, stained glass, statues, mosaics or other sculptures, monuments, fountains, arches or other structures of a permanent or temporary character intended for display or commemoration. No existing work of art in the possession of the city shall be removed, relocated or altered in any way without being submitted to the ~~commissioner~~ for report and recommendation.

The ~~commissioner~~ shall have similar authority and duties to those

stated in the first paragraph of this section with respect to
the design of buildings, bridges, viaducts, elevated ways, gates,
fences, law standards or other structures erected on or to be
erected upon land belonging to the city and connecting arches,
bridges, structures and approaches which are the property of
any corporation or private individual and which shall extend over
or upon any street, avenue, highway, park or public place of the
city.

Section 6. The commission shall decide any matter submitted to
it involving an expenditure of less than one thousand dollars
within fifteen days after submission, and upon any other such
matter, within thirty days after submission. If it fails to do
so, its recommendation shall be considered unnecessary.

Section 7. The commission may advise with owners of private
property in relation to the beautification of such property, and
anyone contemplating the erection of any building or the making of
any improvement thereon may submit the plans and designs or
sketches thereof to the Municipal Art Commission for advice and
recommendations for which no charge shall be made by the commission.

Section 8. This ordinance shall be in force and effect five
days from and after its passing, approval and publishing or posting,
according to law.
