#### **ORDINANCE 0-4596**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO CITY FLOATS, MOORAGES, AND TOUR BOAT FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, as part of a review of the Kirkland Municipal Code ("KMC") by Councilmember Toby Nixon, it was recommended that Chapter 14.36 of the KMC related to city floats, moorages, and tour boat facilities be amended in certain respects to reflect current practices and eliminate outdated references; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to acknowledge that commercial tour boat facilities in the future may be located at city-owned piers other than the Marina Park moorage pier; and

WHEREAS, references to the city-owned Marina Park moorage pier no longer need to include references to its construction in 1988; and

WHEREAS, it is the city's practice to allow moorage for sale or commercial display if written approval from the city is first obtained; and

WHEREAS, to harmonize related sections of the KMC, including KMC Section 14.36.050(b), which provides that the city's daily moorage fee is due at the time a watercraft is tied up at a dock, KMC Section 14.36.050 should be amended to provide that such fee is not due in advance, but instead at the time a watercraft is tied up at a dock and by noon on each following day the watercraft remains moored at the city-owned pier; and

WHEREAS, it is no longer necessary either to direct that commercial tour boat passengers be transported to city-owned piers exclusively by bus or van or to prohibit the arrival of passengers by private car, taxi or commercial limousine.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 14.36.010 is amended to read as follows:

#### 14.36.010 Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply when used in this chapter:

- (1) "Commercial tour boat facility" means the extension to the Marina Park moorage pier, or any other city-owned pier, constructed in 1988, and that is signed for commercial tour boat usage only.
- (2) "Marina Park moorage pier" means the city pier located in Marina Park, not including the commercial tour boat facility.
- (3) "Parks director" means the city's director of parks and community services or his or her designee.

 (4) "Second Avenue South pier" means the city-owned pier located in the Second Avenue South right-of-way in Lake Washington.

<u>Section 2</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 14.36.020 is amended to read as follows:

### 14.36.020 Parks and community services department responsibilities.

The parks director, or his or her designee, shall be responsible for the overall administration, maintenance and operation of all city floats, piers and moorages, including the commercial tour boat facilitiesy (the 1988 extension of the Marina Park moorage pier).

<u>Section 3</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 14.36.030 is amended to read as follows:

### 14.36.030 City floats and moorage.

- (a) Unless posted to restrict or prohibit moorage, all city floats, piers, or moorages may be used by watercraft for moorage purposes as provided in this chapter. Moorage for the following purposes is prohibited:
- (1) Handling freight;
- (2) Mooring of boats or watercraft for sale or commercial display without having obtained prior written permission from the city;
- (3) Receiving or discharging fee-paying or commercial passengers without having obtained prior written permission from the city;
- (4) Any other commercial use except for authorized use of the commercial tour boat facility.
- (b) No moorage or other tie-up by ropes, cables or other fastenings shall be made except by use of tie-up cleats provided for such purposes.

<u>Section 4</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 14.36.050 is amended to read as follows:

### 14.36.050 Moorage prohibitions.

- (a) No person shall moor a watercraft at a city moorage facility without registering and paying the established fee that is due at the time the watercraft is tied up to the pier. The moorage rate for additional days is due at noon on each day. in advance. No person shall continue to moor a watercraft at a city moorage facility without paying the established moorage fee as it becomes due.
- (b) No person shall moor a watercraft in an area that has been posted to prohibit moorage. No person shall, without city authorization, moor a watercraft in an area that has been posted as a restricted area.
- (c) The tying together or rafting of watercraft moored at a city moorage facility is prohibited.

<u>Section 5</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 14.36.230 is hereby repealed as follows:

# 14.36.230 Commercial tour boat facility—Transportation of passengers.

97 98 99 100 101 102 103	When departing from the commercial tour boat facility, all passengers scheduled to embark shall be brought by the tour operator or sponsor to the facility by bus or van. Arrival of embarking passengers in private passenger vehicles, taxis or commercial limousines shall be prohibited. The conveying bus or van shall unload and load passengers, and park during the interim, only at a places specifically designated by the parks director.
104 105 106 107	Section 6. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect five days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication pursuant to Section 1.08.017, Kirkland Municipal Code in the summary form attached to the original of this ordinance and by this reference approved by the City Council.

## PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE <u>0-4596</u>

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Amends Section 14.36.010 of the Kirkland Municipal Code ("KMC") by changing the definition of "commercial tour boat facility" to include any other city-owned pier.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. Amends KMC Section 14.36.020 related to parks and community services department responsibilities.

 $\underline{\sf SECTION~3}.$  Amends KMC Section 14.36.030 related to City floats and moorage.

 $\underline{\text{SECTION 4}}.$  Amends KMC 14.36.050 related to moorage prohibitions.

SECTION 5. Repeals KMC Section 14.36.230.

<u>SECTION 6</u>. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.

<u>SECTION 7</u>. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective date as five days after publication of summary.
