ORDINANCE 0-4600

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO STREET AND CURB CUTTING.

WHEREAS, as part of a review of the Kirkland Municipal Code ("KMC") by Councilmember Toby Nixon, it was recommended that KMC Chapter 19.12 related to street and curb cutting be amended to revise and update the name of the public works department and a standard specification manual.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.020 is amended to read as follows:

19.12.020 Permit required.

No person, firm, or corporation shall disrupt a street, sidewalk or curb or place a utility in a right-of-way without first obtaining a separate right-of-way permit for each disruption from the public works service department.

<u>Section 2</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.040 is amended to read as follows:

19.12.040 Permit—Preinspection.

Prior to the issuance of any right-of-way permit for a street or curb disruption, the location may be inspected by a public works service department inspection official for the purpose of determining the most satisfactory location for the installation.

<u>Section 3</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.070 is amended to read as follows:

19.12.070 Permit—Expiration.

Every permit issued by the public <u>works</u> service department under the provisions of this chapter shall expire ninety days after issuance of the permit; however, in no case shall a project take longer than fifteen days to complete after starting work in the right-of-way.

<u>Section 4</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.080 is amended to read as follows:

19.12.080 Permit—Suspension or revocation.

The director of public <u>works</u> service, or his <u>or her</u> designate, may in writing suspend or revoke a permit issued under the provisions of this chapter whenever the permit was issued in error, or on the basis of incorrect information supplied, or in violation of any other ordinance or regulation of the city.

 <u>Section 5</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.095 is amended to read as follows:

19.12.095 Insurance required—Bond as alternative to restoration deposit.

No permit shall issue until the permittee has filed with the city a certificate of comprehensive public liability insurance, including the city as a named insured in limits of not less than one million dollars; provided, however, that a permit issued pursuant to Section 19.12.030(6) may be issued upon filing an insurance certificate showing insurance limits of a lesser amount so long as the director of public works services is satisfied that such lesser amount is sufficient to protect the interest of the city. Public utilities will be exempt from posting the restoration deposit required by Section 19.12.090 so long as they keep and maintain on file with the city an approved indemnity bond in the amount of ten thousand dollars or more conditioned upon faithful performance of the conditions and regulations of this chapter.

<u>Section 6</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.150 is amended to read as follows:

19.12.150 Curb opening locations.

The location of each curb opening must be approved by the public works service department. Application for a curb opening less than twenty feet from an intersection may only be approved under unusual circumstances. The city reserves the right to deny any request to open any curb.

<u>Section 7</u>. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.150 is amended to read as follows:

19.12.160 Special conditions.

At the discretion of the director of public <u>works</u> services, one or more of the following requirements may be specified when conditions require their use. Wherever such special conditions are required, they shall be set forth on the permit at the time of issuance, or as an amendment to the permit in those instances where conditions requiring their use become known after the permit has been issued.

- (1) Installation within the right-of-way shall be made by a method approved by the director of public works services. Cuts shall be made only in areas approved by the city engineer. All improved or unimproved areas within the right-of-way shall be restored to an equal or better condition.
- (2) Signs, cones, barricades, and all other traffic control devices to protect and control pedestrian and vehicular traffic in the construction area shall be used as prescribed by the traffic engineer, and in accordance with the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, Part V."
- (3) One or more traffic lanes shall be kept open at all times. Moving traffic shall be properly controlled by uniformed <u>flagger flagmen</u>, if specified. Hours of operation during construction and

97 restoration shall be as specified. Ingress and egress for vehicles and personnel to abutting 98 99 property shall be maintained at all times. 100 Backfill and replacement of pavement surface shall be done to the satisfaction of the director of public works services. Unless 101 102 otherwise specified by the director of public works or his or her designee the city engineer, backfill material shall conform to the 103 most recent Washington State Department of Transportation 104 standard specifications for roads and bridges. Standard 105 Specifications for Municipal Public Works, specifically Section 26, 106 Page 41 of the specifications. 107 Any inspection time in excess of one hour will be invoiced 108 109 separately. 110 Section 8. Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.12.180 is 111 amended to read as follows: 112 113 114 19.12.180 Enforcement authority. 115 Enforcement authority rests with the director of public works services or his or her his/her designee which may include personnel of 116 the planning and building department or construction and project 117 118 management departments. 119 Section 9. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to 120 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the 121 122 ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected. 123 124 125 Section 10. PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE 0-4600

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO STREET AND CURB CUTTING.

- <u>SECTIONS 1 3</u>. Amend department to be the public works department related to required permits, preinspection and expiration.
- <u>SECTION 4</u>. Amends department to be the public works department related to permit suspension or revocation and updates the director pronoun to be he or she.
- <u>SECTION 5</u>. Amends department to be the public works department related to insurance requirements.
- <u>SECTION 6</u>. Amends department to be the public works department related to approval of curb cut openings.
- <u>SECTION 7</u>. Amends special conditions to be at the discretion of the director of public works or his or her designee and amends backfill and replacement of pavement surfaces.
- SECTION 8. Amends department names to be the public works and the planning and building departments related to enforcement authority.
 - <u>SECTION 9</u>. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.
- <u>SECTION 10</u>. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective date as five days after publication of summary.
