

RESOLUTION R-5271

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ALLOCATING THE CITY'S PORTION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS FOR 2018.

1 WHEREAS, on May 20, 2014, the City Council authorized the  
2 City's participation in the King County Community Development Block  
3 Grant and HOME Investment Partnerships Program (CDBG/HOME)  
4 Consortium as a Joint Agreement City and the City entered into an  
5 Interlocal Agreement with King County for that purpose; and  
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7 WHEREAS, on June 6, 2017, the City Council extended its  
8 Interlocal Agreement with King County as a Joint Agreement City  
9 through 2020; and  
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11 WHEREAS, as a Joint Agreement City, the City of Kirkland  
12 receives funds in support of programs and projects that directly benefit  
13 our community, including but not limited to home repair, affordable  
14 housing, community facilities, public infrastructure, and human services;  
15 and  
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17 WHEREAS, as part of the Interlocal Agreement with King County,  
18 the City of Kirkland must develop a plan for allocating its portion of the  
19 CDBG funds each year; and  
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21 WHEREAS, toward developing such a plan, the Human Services  
22 Commission held a public hearing on August 22, 2017, at which time  
23 the Commission provided an opportunity for the public to comment on  
24 recommendations for the plan, which recommendations are now being  
25 forwarded to the City Council.  
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27 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City  
28 of Kirkland as follows:  
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30 Section 1. The recommendations of the Human Services  
31 Commission are accepted and approved by the City Council.  
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33 Section 2. Based on estimates provided by the United States  
34 Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the City intends  
35 to allocate 2018 funds as follows:  
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- 37 (a) \$113,587 of Capital Projects funds to A Regional Coalition  
38 for Housing Trust Fund for affordable housing projects;  
39 (b) \$29,892 of Public Services funds to Congregations for the  
40 Homeless to support a winter shelter and day center for  
41 individuals experiencing homelessness; and  
42 (c) \$29,892 of Planning & Administration funds to support the  
43 City's administration of the CDBG program.

44            Section 3. In the event the funding level actually provided by  
45 HUD is more or less than estimated, the above projects, services and  
46 administration should receive proportionate increases or decreases  
47 based upon the final distribution amount.
