

ORDINANCE NO. 996

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON, VACATING THAT CERTAIN PORTION OF UNOPENED ALLEY LYING MID-BLOCK BETWEEN 4TH AVENUE AND CENTRAL WAY AND EXTENDING FROM 4TH STREET TO 5TH STREET.

WHEREAS, by resolution passed the 19<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1965, the City Council of the City of Kirkland set the date of August 16, 1965, for hearing upon the proposed vacation of that certain alley as more fully hereinafter described, and

WHEREAS, due and proper notice of said hearing was had in accordance with law, and

WHEREAS, following said public hearing a vote of the Council was taken favoring said vacation, and

WHEREAS, it appears desirable and to the best interests of the City and the property owners abutting thereon that said alley be vacated,

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the following specifically described unopened alley situate in Kirkland, King County, Washington, and lying mid-block between Central Way and 4th Avenue and extending between 4th Street and 5th Street in the City of Kirkland and described as follows:

That certain alley situate in Kirkland, King County, Washington, lying within Block 96, Kirkland Terrace, according to plat thereof, records of King County, Washington,

be and the same hereby is vacated.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect five days from and after its passage by the council and publication as required.
