

ORDINANCE NO. 1160

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CERTAIN CRIMES AND OFFENSES; PROHIBITING THE INTENTIONAL INHALATION OF FUMES FROM CERTAIN GLUES, CEMENTS AND ADHESIVES OR THE SALE THEREOF TO MINORS WITHOUT AUTHORIZATION BY PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to intentionally smell or inhale the fumes from any glue, cement, or any other adhesive containing one or more of the following chemical compounds: acetone, acetate, benzine, butyl alcohol, ethyl alcohol, ethylene, dichloride, isopropyl alcohol, emthyl ethyl ketone, pentachlorophenol, petroleum ether or toluene, for the purpose of becoming intoxicated, inebriated, excited or stupified; Provided, this section shall not be construed as applying to the inhalation of any anesthetic for medical or dental purposes.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500. or by imprisonment in jail for not to exceed six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect five (5) days from and after its passage by the Council and publication as required by law.
