RESOLUTION R-5319

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATED TO INTEGRATING AFFORDABLE HOUSING, MIXED-USE, AND TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES INTO NEIGHBORHOOD PLAN UPDATES.

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2018, the City Council accepted the recommendations of the Kirkland Housing Strategy Advisory Group as outlined in the Housing Strategy Plan and adopted the Housing Strategy Work Program for 2018-2020, implementing those recommendations; and

7 WHEREAS, the Housing Strategy Plan contains a strong 8 recommendation that the City Council provide direction to the Planning 9 Commission, staff, and residents involved in the neighborhood plan 10 updates that the strategies contained within the Housing Strategy Plan 11 be used as guiding principles during each neighborhood plan update 12 process; and

WHEREAS, The Housing Strategy Plan states there should be a more complete range of housing choices in the community, and that efforts to increase capacity should create a range of affordable housing options today and in the future to serve all ages, incomes and abilities such as people experiencing homelessness, aging seniors, students, a diverse workforce, and "missing middle" housing; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Strategy Plan identifies the creation of
more Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) throughout the City as a critical
priority strategy that can provide affordable housing options for many
incomes, ages and abilities; and

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WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan states that neighborhood plans are a fundamental component of the Comprehensive Plan and allow a more detailed examination of issues affecting smaller geographic areas within the City and clarify how broader City goals and policies in the Citywide Elements apply to each neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, a primary objective of the Comprehensive Plan is the development of 10-minute neighborhoods – mixed-use communities where residents can walk short distances from their home to destinations that meet their daily needs, including transit stops; and

WHEREAS, the City and its partner agencies such as Sound Transit, King County Metro, and the Washington State Department of Transportation are investing heavily in new transit facilities throughout Kirkland and surrounding communities, including new Bus Rapid Transit service and stations along the I-405 corridor, and these transit facilities create critical opportunities for successful higher-density market-rate and affordable housing. NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City
of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The City Council directs the Planning Commission, staff, and residents involved in the neighborhood plan update process to incorporate the following elements into all future neighborhood plans:

- Opportunities for housing serving a diversity of incomes in every neighborhood;
 - b. Options to increase flexibility for creating new Accessory Dwelling Units in every neighborhood;

c. A 10-minute neighborhood focus, including: transit-supportive housing and employment densities; neighborhood businesses that provide a complete set of services; mixed-use centers with affordable housing and public open space; and transition zones between centers and lower-density neighborhoods that provide substantial opportunities for attached housing, compact housing, and other innovative housing types.

d. Transit-oriented development residential and mixed-use opportunities in areas adjacent to existing or planned high capacity transit, including Bus Rapid Transit.
