

ORDINANCE NO. 2221

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON, VACATING THAT CERTAIN WALKWAY DEDICATED WITHIN BRIDLE TREE PLAT NO. 2 AS TRACT "E"

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with the City of Kirkland signed by owners of interest in real property representing more than two-thirds of the property abutting upon the hereinafter described walkway, and

WHEREAS, it appears that the abutting owners of said walkway desire to have it vacated and to then reconvey to the City a new walkway to replace such vacated walkway, and

WHEREAS, by resolution heretofore adopted by the City Council of the City of Kirkland, a date was set for public hearing upon the proposed vacation, and

WHEREAS, due and proper notice of said hearing was had and in accordance with law, and

WHEREAS, following said public hearing held May 7, 1973, a vote of the City Council was taken favoring said street walkway vacation, and

WHEREAS, it appears desirable and to the best interests of the City, its residents and property owners abutting thereon that said walkway be vacated,

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The following specifically described public pedestrian walkway be and the same hereby is vacated, to-wit:

Tract "E", Bridle Tree No. 2, according to plat thereof, records of King County, Washington.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect five days from and after its passage by the Council and publication as required by law. The City Clerk is hereby directed to delay such publication, and thereby, the effective date of this ordinance, until there has been delivered to the

City in proper form a valid deed conveying to the City the replacement walkway.
