

ORDINANCE NO. 2285

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO THE POWER AND AUTHORITY OF KIRKLAND POLICE OFFICERS TO MAKE ARRESTS AND AMENDING SECTIONS 1.04.040 AND 1.04.050 OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. Section 1.04.040 Powers of Arrest and Section 1.04.050, Arrest Powers Deemed Additional of the Kirkland Municipal Code are hereby each amended to read as follows:

"1.04.040 Powers of Arrest. Any police officer of the City having information to support a reasonable belief that a person has committed or is committing a violation of a City Ordinance that constitutes a misdemeanor involving physical harm or threats of harm to any person or property or the unlawful taking of property or involving the use or possession of cannabis or driving or being in physical control of a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicants or controlled substances shall have the authority to arrest the person."

"1.04.050 Arrest Powers Deemed Additional. The authority and power to arrest specified in Section 1.04.040 shall be in addition to all other powers of arrest as may exist under the laws and the statutes of the State of Washington and the Ordinances of the City of Kirkland [,-provided-that nothing-in-this-Section-and-Section-1.04.040-shall-extend
or-otherwise-affect-the-powers-of-arrest-relating-to-the
use-of-motor-vehicles]."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in force and take effect five days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication as required by law.
