ORDINANCE NO. 2456

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ESTABLISHING A PIER AND MOORAGE FACILITY IMPROVEMENT, MAINTENANCE, AND REPAIR ACCOUNT WITHIN THE PARK AND MUNICIPAL RESERVE FUND AND PROVIDING THAT ALL MONIES RECEIVED BY THE CITY FROM MOORAGE FEES AND PIER DAMAGES PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 14.36 KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE, SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN SAID ACCOUNT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The Director of Administration and Finance, as City Treasurer, is hereby directed to establish within the Park and Municipal Reserve Fund an account to be known as the Pier and Moorage Improvement, Maintenance, and Repair Account. Said account shall be used solely for the improvement of the pier and moorage facilities provided by the City of Kirkland within the parks and street ends of the city situate within or adjacent to the Lake Washington shoreline within and without the city limits. For the purposes of this ordinance, the word improvement shall include, but not be limited to, repair and maintenance of such facilities, and the installation, construction and/or reconstruction of new or existing pier and moorage facilities.

Section 2. Authorization to expend monies from said account shall be subject to approval by the City Council. Such approval may be expressed by inclusion of an item, therefore, in the annual budget or such other appropriate action by the City Council as may be permitted by law. Such authorization shall not lapse at the end of the budgetary year, but may be carried forward provided that such carried forward appropriation should be included and so identified in the budgets for succeeding years.

Section 3. All monies received by the City for moorage fees, moorage violation fines, or reimbursement for damages to pier or moorage facilities, all as provided for by Chapter 14.36 Kirkland Municipal Code, shall be deposited into the account created by this ordinance. The City Council may direct the transfer to or deposit in said account of such additional grants, gifts, monies, or general city revenues as it may authorize by ordinance, resolution, or motion duly passed.

<u>Section 4.</u> This ordinance shall be in force and take effect five days from and after its passage by the City Council and publication as required by law.
