ORDINANCE NO. 2493

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES AND AMENDING SECTIONS 11.76.010, 11.76.030, 11.76.040 OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE.

WHEREAS, Section 17, Chapter 178, Washington Laws 1979, First Ex. Session, relating to the removal, storage, and disposal of abandoned vehicles requires that local ordinances provide for the processing of such vehicles in a manner consistent with said chapter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. Section 11.76.010 of the Kirkland Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"11.76.010 Definitions. For the purpose of this chapter:

(1) "Abandoned automobile hulk" or abandoned vehicle hulk means the abandoned remnant or remains of any motor vehicle which is inoperative and cannot be made mechanically operative without the addition of vital parts or mechanisms and the application of a substantial amount of labor to effect repairs;

- (2) "Abandoned vehicle" means any vehicle left within the right-of-way of any public street, highway, alley or way open to the public or upon the property of another without the consent of the owner of such property for a period of twenty-four hours; provided, however, that the vehicle shall not be considered abandoned if its owner or operator is unable to remove it from the place where it is located and so notifies law enforcement officials and requests assistance. - (3) A registered abandoned vehicle disposer or a registered disposer means any currently licensed tow truck operator, garage keeper, or other person engaged in the busines of removing, storing or disposing of vehicles, abandoned vehicles, or abandoned vehicle hulks, and who is properly registered and licensed pursuant to RCW 46.52.108 as now or hereafter amended.
- Section 2. Section 11.76.030 of the Kirkland Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "11.76.030 Procedure where abandoned within public right-of-way or on other public property. The Chief of Police shall cause any vehicle or automobile hulk found and declared by Section 11.76.020 (1) or (2) to be a public nuisance to be forthwith impounded and shall

immediately place said vehicle in the custody of a registered disposer, who shall thereupon process said vehicle in the manner provided in RCW 46.52.111 and RCW 46.52.111. / upon-impound; notify-the-Chief-of-the-State-Patrol-and-the-King-Gounty-Executive; - (or-other county-official-performing-the-function-of-county sheriff); --If; -at-the-expiration-of-fifteen-days-from impound; -the-vehicle-or-automobile-hulk-has-not-been claimed; -it-shall-be-disposed-of-in-the-manner-provided for-in-RCW-46.52; 116.7

Section 3. Section 11.76.040 of the Kirkland Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"11.76.040 Procedure where abandoned on private property. Upon the request of or with the permission of the property owner, the Chief of Police shall cause any vehicle or automobile hulk found and declared by Section 11.76.020 (3) to be a public nuisance, to be forthwith impounded and shall immediately place said vehicle in the custody of a registered disposer who shall thereupon process said vehicle in the manner provided for in RCW 46.52.111 and RCW 46.52.112. /notify the-Ghief-of-the-Washington-State-Patrol-and-the-King Gounty-Executive-(or-other-King-Gounty-official-performing-the-appropriate-functions-of-the-county-sheriff).

(2)--In-the-event-such-request-for-hearing-is received,-give-notice-of-the-time,-location-and-date-of such-hearing-on-the-questions-of-abandonment-and-removal of-the-vehicle-or-part-thereof-as-a-public-nuisance, which-notice-shall-be-mailed-by-certified-mail,-with-a five-day-return-requested-to-the-owner-of-the-land-as shown-on-the-last-equalized-assessment-roll-and-to-the last-registered-and-legal-owner-of-record,-unless-the-vehicle-or-automobile-hulk-is-in-such-condition-that identification-numbers-are-not-available-to-determine ownership;

(3)--The-owner-of-the-land-on-which-the-vehicle-or automobile-hulk-is-located,-may-appear-in-person-at-the hearing-or-present-a-written-statement-in-time-for consideration-at-the-hearing-and-deny-responsibility for-the-presence-of-the-vehicle-on-the-land-with-his reasons-for-such-denial:--If-it-is-determined-at-the

hearing-that-the-vehicle-or-automobile-hulk-was-placed on-the-land-without-the-consent-of-the-landowner,-and that-he-has-not-subsequently-acquiesced-in-its-presence, then-the-cost-of-removal-of-the-vehicle-or-automobile hulk-shall-not-be-assessed-against-said-property,-nor shall-such-costs-be-in-any-other-manner-charged-or collected-from-the-property-owner;

(4)--Fifteen-days-after-giving-of-the-notice required-by-subsection-(1)-of-this-section,-or-where-a hearing-has-been-requested-fifteen-days-after-the-date of-the-hearing,-the-vehicle,-automobile-hulk-or-parts thereof-shall-be-removed-at-the-request-of-the-Ghief-of Police-and-disposed-of-to-a-licensed-auto-wrecker-and-notice-of-this-fact-shall-be-given-to-the-Washington State-Patrol-and-the-Department-of-Motor-Vehicles-7

The foregoing procedure shall also apply as to any abandoned automobile hulk declared to be a public nuisance by virtue of the provisions of Section 11.76.060.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in force five (5) days from and after its passage by the City Council and publication as required by law.
