

ORDINANCE NO. 2725

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO USE TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY ANY PORTION OF STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY FOR BUSINESS OR OTHER PRIVATE USES AND ADDING A NEW SECTION TO CHAPTER 19.04 OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby added to Chapter 19.04 of the Kirkland Municipal Code, a new section to read as follows:


19.04.050 Private Use of Street Right-of-Way Without Permit Prohibited. It is unlawful for any person to either temporarily or permanently use or utilize any portion of a street right-of-way (whether or not improved and including sidewalk or walkway) for personal use, place of business or other private use, without first obtaining from the City of Kirkland a street use permit; provided, however, that this section shall not be construed to prohibit the incorporation of the unused right-of-way portion of an improved street into the landscaping design of the abutting private property.

Section 2. Sections 19.04.010 and 19.04.020 are each hereby repealed.


Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect five days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and posting or publication, as required by law.

Passed by majority vote of the Kirkland City Council in regular, open meeting this 17th day of January, 1983.


