#### ORDINANCE O-4727

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ADOPTING LEGISLATION TO AUTHORIZE A SALES AND USE TAX FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND FACILITIES PROVIDING SUPPORTIVE SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1406 (CHAPTER 338, LAWS OF 2019), AND ADOPTING KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 5.28.

WHEREAS, in the 2019 Regular Session, the Washington
 State Legislature approved, and the Governor signed, Substitute
 House Bill 1406 (Chapter 338, Laws of 2019) ("SHB 1406"); and

WHEREAS, SHB 1406 authorizes the governing body of a city with a population of 100,000 or less to impose a local sales and use tax for the acquisition, construction or rehabilitation of affordable housing or facilities providing supportive housing, for the operations and maintenance costs of affordable or supportive housing, and for providing rental assistance to tenants; and

WHEREAS, the tax will be credited against state sales taxes collected within the City of Kirkland ("City") and, therefore, will not result in higher sales and use taxes within the City and will represent an additional source of funding to address housing needs in the City; and

WHEREAS, the tax must be used to assist persons whose
 income is at or below sixty percent of the King County median
 income; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution R-5313,
accepting the recommendations of the Housing Strategy Advisory
Group and putting in place the Housing Strategy Work Program
for 2018-2020; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2019, the City Council approved Resolution R-5344, adopting the City's 2019 State Legislative Agenda, which included supporting "new local funding and policy tools to address homelessness and create more affordable housing" as a top priority; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined that there is a demand
and need for affordable housing and that imposing the sales and
use tax to address this need will benefit its residents; and

30 WHEREAS, the City Council, in accordance with RCW 82.14.540, adopted Resolution R-5385 on September 3, 2019, 31 declaring its intent to adopt legislation to authorize the maximum 32 33 capacity of the sales and use tax authorized by SHB 1406; and WHEREAS, the Department of Revenue requires 30 days' 34 notice of adoption of sales tax credits and the credit will then take 35 effect on the first day of the month following the 30-day period; 36 and 37 WHEREAS, the local sales and use tax revenue shall be 38 spent on acquiring, rehabilitating, or constructing affordable 39 housing or supportive housing and other related expenditures as 40 authorized by RCW 82.14.540; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance constitutes the legislation 42 required by SHB 1406; and 43

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to impose the local 44 sales and use tax authorized by SHB 1406 as set forth herein. 45 46

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland 47 48 do ordain as follows: 49

Section 1. A new Kirkland Municipal Code Chapter 5.28 is 50 hereby adopted to read as follows: 51 52

#### Chapter 5.28

#### SALES AND USE TAX FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING

#### 5.28.010 Imposition of sales—Affordable and 68 supportive housing. 69

70 As authorized by RCW 82.14.540(2), upon every taxable event, as defined in RCW 82.14.020, occurring within the 71 city, the city shall receive a portion of the State of 72

Washington's portion of the state sales tax or use tax that 73 is collected pursuant to RCW Chapters 82.08 and 82.12, 74 as the same now exist or may hereafter be amended.

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#### 5.28.020 Rate of tax imposed.

The rate of the tax imposed by Section 5.28.010 shall be 78 0.0073% of the selling price or value of the article used, 79 as the case may be. The tax imposed under RCW 80 82.14.540(2) must be deducted from the amount of tax 81 otherwise required to be collected or paid to the 82 Department of Revenue under Chapters 82.08 and 82.12 83 RCW. 84

5.28.030 Administration and collection of tax.

The administration and collection of the tax imposed by 87 this chapter shall be in accordance with the provisions of 88 RCW 82.14.050, as the same now exists or may hereafter 89 be amended. 90

The city must report annually to the Washington State 92 Department of Commerce on the collection and use of the 93 revenue. The Department of Commerce must adopt rules 94 prescribing content of such reports. By December 1, 2019, 95 and annually thereafter, and in compliance with RCW 96 43.01.036, the Department of Commerce must submit a 97 report annually to the appropriate legislative committees 98 with regard to such uses. 99

## 5.28.040 Purpose of Tax.

Moneys collected or bonds issued under this article may 102 only be used, as required by RCW 82.14.540(6), for the 103 following purposes: 104

(1) Acquiring, rehabilitating, or constructing affordable housing, which may include new units of affordable housing within an existing structure or facilities providing 108 supportive housing services under RCW 71.24.385; or

(2) Funding the operations and maintenance costs of new units of affordable or supportive housing; or

114 (3) Providing rental assistance to tenants.

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In all cases, the housing and services may only be provided to persons whose income is at or below sixty percent of King County median income, as required by RCW 82.14.540(7).

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# 5.28.050 Consent to inspection of records.

The city consents to the inspection of such records as are
necessary to qualify the city for inspection of records of
the Department of Revenue, pursuant to RCW 82.32.330.

## 5.28.060 Authorizing execution of collection.

127 The city manager is authorized to enter into a contract 128 with the Department of Revenue for the collection of this 129 tax.

131 **5.28.070 Penalties.** 

It is unlawful for any seller to fail or refuse to collect taxes
with intent to violate the provisions of this chapter or to
gain some advantage or benefit, either direct or indirect,
or for any buyer to refuse to pay any tax due under this
chapter.

5.28.080 Expiration Date.

The tax imposed under this section will expire 20 years
after the date on which the tax is first imposed.

142 <u>Section 2</u>. If any provision of this ordinance or its
 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
 remainder of the ordinance or the application of the provision to
 other persons or circumstances is not affected.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect five
days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and
publication pursuant to Section 1.08.017, Kirkland Municipal Code
in the summary form attached to the original of this ordinance and
by this reference approved by the City Council.

#### PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 4727

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ADOPTING LEGISLATION TO AUTHORIZE A SALES AND USE TAX FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND FACILITIES PROVIDING SUPPORTIVE SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1406 (CHAPTER 338, LAWS OF 2019), AND ADOPTING KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 5.28.

SECTION 1. Adopts a new Kirkland Municipal Code Chapter 5.28 related to sales and use tax for affordable housing.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.

SECTION 3. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective date as five days after publication of summary.
